



**NewsBank Newspapers** for Ohio provides 30 full-text subscriptions, 17 Ohio publications and 13 major U.S. daily papers. **NewsBank Newspapers** has an easy-to-use online search engine and supplies daily updates. One subscription dates to 1977, while most coverage begins in the 1990s and 2000s. Paid advertisements are not included. *Special Reports* collect articles on popular topics. *America's News Magazines* collects articles from almost 30 popular magazines.

Articles can be read online, saved to disk, e-mailed and printed. Note: Some Instructional Technology Centers (ITCs) have chosen to add local or regional **NewsBank** titles to the main page.

**Use NewsBank Newspapers for:**

- **Current events** on just about any topic
- **National debate topics**
- **Social Studies** – Ohio politics and government
- **Obituaries** of well-known people

A late Delphos native called one of the world's greatest amateur astronomers will be honored with the dedication of a **Ohio** historical marker and a special postal cancellation.

The dedication honoring Leslie Peltier will begin at 11 a.m. Sept. 20 on the lawn of the Delphos Public Library, whose board he served for 30 years.

Mr. Peltier, who lived most of his life in Delphos, attended school through the 10th grade and built his own observatory. By the time of his death in 1980, he had, discovered 12 comets, two novae, and made 132,000 variable star observations.

The marker is an **Ohio Bicentennial** project.
